One of the more meaningful experiences that our organization offers its members is to serve


as a delegate to the OREA Annual Convention. This year it will occur on October 8th at the Hilton Garden Inn Edmond / Oklahoma City North. We get to hear inspiring speakers, get updates on what is happening in our legislature concerning education and our retirement system, and support our PAC which provides encouragement for legislators who support improving both education and our retirement system. TMREA pays for our delegate registration and for the bus transportation to and from the convention for each of our 45 delegates. We are one of only a few units which does that. Since the convention is in Oklahoma City, we leave Tulsa at 6:00 AM and return around 5:00 PM. It's a full day, but we ride in a comfortable bus with air conditioning and a rest room. The convention is a chance to meet and greet other retired educators from across the state and a chance to become better informed. If you haven't attended the convention, I encourage you to volunteer to be a delegate. We are allowed 45 delegates this year. We need more alternate delegates and, because life happens, many of our alternates will get a chance to be full delegates and attend the convention. Our unit covers the registration including lunch and the cost of the bus transportation. You only need to bring money for purchase of vendor items, gift baskets, or donations to the OREA Fund. You must have paid your TMREA and OREA dues to be a delegate.

Peach Pecan Bread 1 c. coarsely chopped pecans 2 peaches peeled, pitted, cut up 2/3 c. granulated sugar 1/4 c. milk 1/4 c. canola oil 2 large eggs 2 c. flour 1 t. salt 2 t. baking powder Stir together the sugar, milk, oil, and eggs. Now mix in the flour, salt, and baking powder. (Batter will be a bit dry.) Fold in peaches and pecans until thoroughly blended. Pour batter into standard 9x5 loaf pan. Bake at 350 for 50-60 minutes, or until knife inserted in middle comes out clean. Allow to cool for 20 min. In a small bowl, whisk together 1/2 c. powdered sugar 2 T. milk. Drizzle over bread when ready to serve.

- 2. The Romans believed that September was watched over by the god of fire, so they always expected September to be full of fire and volcanic eruptions.
